Did you know?

People living with HIV...

Can have a normal life span Those who are on HIV medication, can't pass the virus on to sexual partners

People of African and Caribbean heritage...

Have a higher prevalence of HIV – it is more common than for other communities (especially for Black African women) Are more likely to be diagnosed late with HIV which can result in a greater chance of being hospitalised, reduced life expectancy Are less likely to access sexual health services than other people
